Where to Stay (Mid-Price Hotel)

Hotel Recommendation: Hotel Artemide – Approx. €150–€200 per night

Located in the heart of Rome, Hotel Artemide offers an elegant, comfortable stay with excellent service. It's within walking distance of major attractions like the Trevi Fountain and the Colosseum, making it a perfect base for your adventure.

8:00 AM – Start the Day with a Classic Italian Breakfast

Location: Caffè Greco (Via dei Condotti)

Meal: Cappuccino & Cornetto (~€5–€7 per person)

Start your day like a true Roman with a cappuccino and a fresh cornetto (Italian croissant) at Caffè Greco, one of Rome's oldest and most famous cafés. This charming café is perfect for soaking in the local atmosphere before heading out for a day of exploration.

9:00 AM – Explore the Spanish Steps and Piazza di Spagna

Attraction: Spanish Steps (Free to visit)

Best Photo Spot: From the top of the Spanish Steps, overlooking Piazza di Spagna



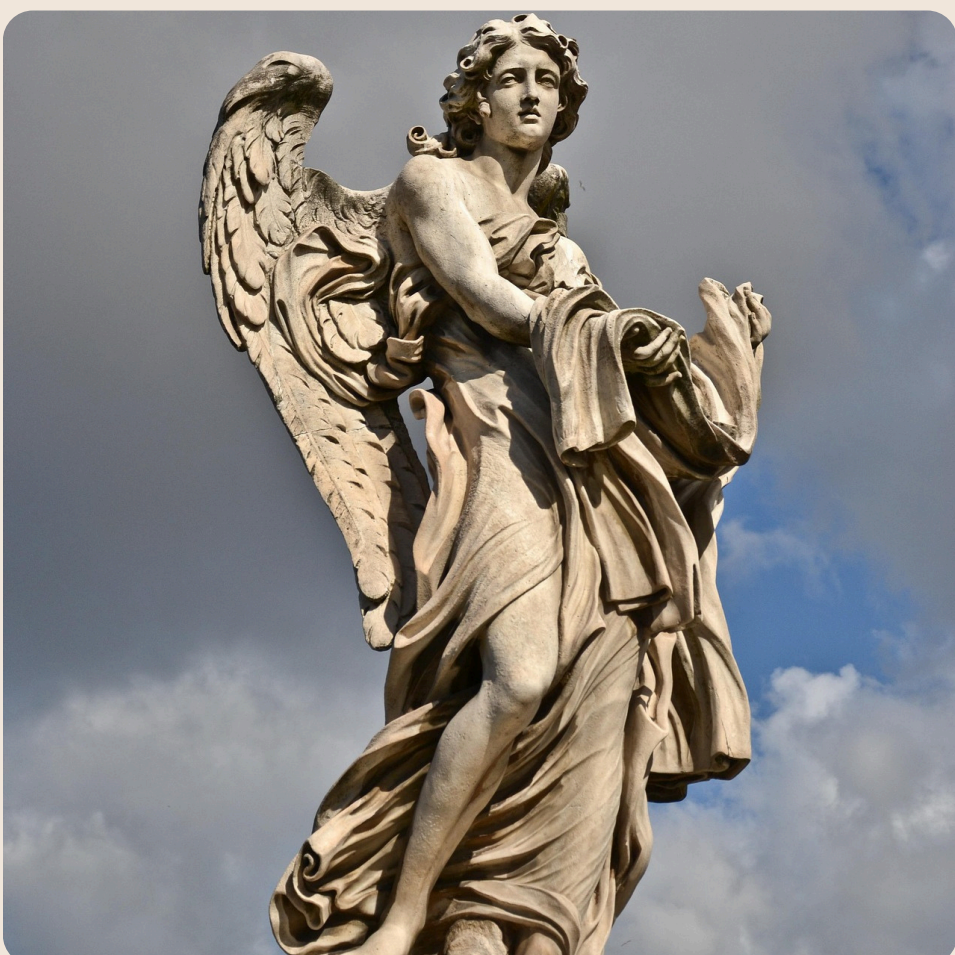
Head to the iconic Spanish Steps, a great spot to take in the city's beauty. Climb to the top for a panoramic view of the piazza and the bustling streets. The area around Piazza di Spagna is also perfect for a few more candid street shots—especially during the morning when the crowd is thinner.

10:00 AM – Visit the Trevi Fountain

Attraction: Trevi Fountain (Free)

Best Photo Spot: Standing on the steps in front of the fountain

A trip to Rome wouldn't be complete without a visit to the Trevi Fountain. Toss a coin into the water (for good luck!) and take some photos from the steps in front of the fountain for a classic shot. The early morning is the best time to visit before the crowds gather, giving you a peaceful moment to appreciate the stunning Baroque architecture.





🕒 11:30 AM – Stroll Through the Pantheon

Attraction: Pantheon (Free entry)

Best Photo Spot: Inside the Pantheon, focusing on the oculus

Next, head to the Pantheon, an ancient Roman temple that's now a church. It's one of the most well-preserved buildings in Rome, with its impressive dome and oculus letting natural light stream in. The inside is magnificent, so be sure to take some shots of the grand interior.

🕒 12:30 PM – Lunch at a Classic Trattoria

Location: Trattoria al 34 (Near the Spanish Steps)

Meal: Classic pasta dishes like Cacio e Pepe or Carbonara (~€15–€20 per person)

For lunch, enjoy a traditional Italian meal at Trattoria al 34. The pasta here is delicious and authentic, and it's a perfect place to savor the flavors of Rome in a cozy setting.



🕒 2:00 PM – Discover the Colosseum and Roman Forum

Attraction: Colosseum (Ticket: ~€16 per person)

Best Photo Spot: From the Colosseum's outer perimeter, capturing the arches and surrounding Roman ruins

No visit to Rome is complete without exploring the Colosseum. The tickets usually include access to the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill, so you can walk through the ruins that once formed the heart of ancient Rome. For the best photos, walk around the outer edge of the Colosseum to capture the iconic arches framed by the ancient stone. If time allows, visit the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill to immerse yourself further into Roman history.

🕒 4:00 PM – Relax at Villa Borghese Gardens

Attraction: Villa Borghese Gardens (Free to walk around)

Best Photo Spot: Near the lake or the terrace with views of Piazza del Popolo

After exploring the Colosseum, take a peaceful walk through Villa Borghese, Rome's central park. You can rent a bike or simply stroll through the expansive gardens, stopping by the lake or the famous Pincio Terrace for beautiful views over the city. This is a great spot for some romantic photos with the greenery and skyline in the background.





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🕒 6:00 PM – Visit the Piazza Navona

Attraction: Piazza Navona (Free)

Best Photo Spot: Fountain of the Four Rivers

Next, head to Piazza Navona, one of Rome's most beautiful squares. Admire the Fountain of the Four Rivers by Bernini, the stunning Baroque architecture, and the artists who often line the square. It's a lovely spot to take a break, snap a few photos, and soak in the lively atmosphere.

🕒 7:30 PM – Dinner in Trastevere

Restaurant: Da Enzo al 29 (Trastevere)

Meal: Roman-style pizza, Saltimbocca alla Romana, or Cacio e Pepe (~€20–€25 per person)

Head to the charming Trastevere neighborhood for an authentic Roman dinner. Da Enzo al 29 is a favorite for locals and tourists alike, offering classic Roman dishes. Enjoy some cacio e pepe (cheese and pepper pasta) or perhaps a delicious Roman pizza while surrounded by the cobbled streets and buzzing nightlife of Trastevere.



🕒 9:30 PM – Evening Stroll Across Ponte Sant'Angelo & Castel Sant'Angelo

Activity: Stroll along the Tiber River and cross Ponte Sant'Angelo (Free)

Best Photo Spot: From Ponte Sant'Angelo, capturing Castel Sant'Angelo illuminated by night

Finish your day with a romantic evening walk along the Tiber River. Cross Ponte Sant'Angelo, the beautiful bridge that leads to Castel Sant'Angelo. The view of the castle and the river at night, especially with the lights reflecting in the water, is absolutely stunning.



🕒 11:00 PM – Nightcap at a Rooftop Bar

Location: Terrazza Caffarelli (Near the Capitoline Hill)

Drink: Cocktail or glass of wine (~€10–€15 per person)

End your day with a drink at one of Rome's rooftop bars. Terrazza Caffarelli offers incredible views of the city, including the Colosseum and St. Peter's Basilica in the distance. Relax with a cocktail in hand and reflect on the amazing experiences of the day.
